



### **REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FROM THE WORLD INITIATIVE FOR SOY IN HUMAN HEALTH (WISHH)**

**TITLE**: Current and prospective U.S. soy protein ingredient distributors serving the Central American Food Industry

I. DATE: April 2, 2024

## **II. PROJECT OBJECTIVE**

The purpose of this Request for Proposal is to obtain ingredient supply chain market intelligence on the Central American food and beverage industry for use in the effort to expand the number of U.S. soy protein commodity ingredients (defatted soy flour, soy concentrate, and soy isolate) distributors serving the region.

## **III. ORGANIZATION BACKGROUND**

The American Soybean Association was founded in 1920 by soybean farmers and extension workers to promote soy for high protein applications in developmental settings. ASA has worked in over 80 countries since the inception of its overseas program in the mid-1950s. The World Initiative for Soy in Human Health (WISHH) was founded in 2000 to expand the work of the ASA in developing and emerging markets to improve health, nutrition, food security, and to build the groundwork for future U.S. soy protein markets. WISHH provides services in food technology, business development, nutrition services, and program and proposal development. WISHH expertise extends beyond food and into aquaculture, poultry, and animal feed.

The U.S.-based program in St. Louis, Missouri, operates in sub-Saharan Africa, Asia, and Central America and the Dominican Republic. WISHH connects trade and development to strengthen agricultural value chains in developing and emerging economies, creating long-term demand for U.S. soy in countries where trade is pivotal to improving accessibility, affordability, and acceptability of high-quality plant and animal-sourced proteins. The Program's initiatives broadly fit into two arenas: (1) trade-building long-term, early-stage market development, and (2) trade-building international agriculture and economic development.

WISHH achieves its mission by working in close partnership with the public and private sectors, and non-governmental organizations. The Program has decades of experience in commercial food development and agricultural development programming and draws upon the resources and experience of partners and the services of a cadre of WISHH consultants with technical expertise in the agricultural, international, and commercial development spheres. The Program takes pride in its growing portfolio of success with U.S. government-funding, including USDA (Food for Progress, McGovern-Dole, Global Broad-Based Initiative, Foreign Market Development, Market Access Program, Emerging Markets Program, Agricultural Trade

Program, and Quality Samples Program) and USAID funding in both prime and sub-recipient capacities. WISHH has also attracted both private sector and other complementary funding sources from various donors to build on and leverage core funding from Qualified State Soybean Boards.

# **IV. SCOPE OF WORK**

WISHH has received FY2024 Market Development Program grant funding from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Foreign Agricultural Service to conduct promotional activities with food processors and distributors serving the Central American and Dominican Republic region. The activities focus on increasing the awareness and use of U.S. soy protein commodity ingredients (defatted soy flour, soy concentrates, and soy isolates) in food and beverage applications in the region. Currently, there is interest in and demand for U.S. soy protein ingredients from food and beverage processors in the region. However, prospective buyers are encountering challenges securing supply. A large majority of these ingredient purchase inquiries are for less than full shipping container size orders. The challenge has been to locate U.S. soy protein suppliers willing to sell less-than-container quantities to first-time buyers who are medium and large F/B companies in the region. WISHH is building prospective distributors in the region to overcome this impediment.

The firm selected will conduct a market research study of the Central American food and beverage industry supply chain that characterizes current U.S. soy protein ingredient availability in the region; identifies current and prospective soy protein ingredient distributors; as well as includes the following:

- Distributor company name and contact details
- The countries and market segments (baking, processed meat, etc.) they currently serve
- Their current product offerings
- Their ingredient suppliers and corresponding country of origin
- Reasons why they buy from the suppliers they do
- Their interest in expanding their product offerings and markets covered in the near future
- For those not carrying soy protein ingredients, gauge their openness to carrying them and those sourced from the U.S.
- Their interest in receiving qualified sales leads for U.S. sourced soy protein ingredients
- The value they associate with/or not carrying/starting to carry U.S.-sourced soy protein ingredients
- Gauge their openness to receiving and/or meeting with qualified sales leads for U.S.sourced soy protein ingredients
- Their perception of the value/benefits to their companies they would gain by adding U.S. soy protein ingredients to their product list
- The obstacles they associate with adding U.S. soy protein ingredients to their product list
- The technical assistance they envision needing to add U.S. soy protein ingredients to their product list

• The value to their company from WISHH providing free-of-charge, after-the-sale technical assistance to their customers in order to maximize the customer's experience using U.S. soy protein ingredients.

Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua.

### VII. SELECTION CRITERIA AND CRITERIA WEIGHTS

Proposals submitted will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

Comprehensiveness	35%
Consultant skills/experience	30%
Cost	20%
Timing	15%
TOTAL	100%

Special consideration will be given to Women or Minority Owned Small Business (WMOSB) entities with SBA certifications (proof of certification must be provided at time of submission).

**VIII. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS.** The Consultant(s) will have the following qualifications:

- At least five years of market research/market assessment experience, ingredient procurement, and/or previous work experience in the food and beverage industry in Central America and/or the Dominican Republic.
  - Consultants who do not have experience evaluating the food/beverage markets in these regions are strongly encouraged to partner with qualified

industry/technical expert(s) based in the region/country who have had significant commercial category experience in the study region.

- Experience in study design, data collection and analysis of qualitative data and supervisory capabilities in each of these areas.
- Proficient in written and spoken Spanish and English.

Proposals must contain at a minimum the specific criteria requested in the Request for Proposal:

- 1. A description of the bidder's capabilities and experiences (can be submitted as a CV)
- 2. Daily professional rate in U.S. dollars (USD \$)
- 3. The following questions need to be answered in a separate document:
  - What is your market research/market assessment experience, ingredient procurement, and/or previous work experience and for how long in the food and beverage industry in the Central American region?
  - If you will be partnering, what commercial category/marketing research experience does your industry/technical expert have in the region?
  - What type of study design, data collection and data analysis experience do you have?
  - Are you proficient in written and spoken Spanish and English?
- 4. Checklist of additional items that must be submitted:
  - Attachment A Technical Proposal Authorization Cover Page Completed and Signed
  - Proposal with 100-word executive summary
  - Proposal detailed budget
  - WMOSB Proof of Certification (if applicable)

Proposals should be submitted no later than 4:00 PM CDT on April 19, 2024. To be considered for award, proposals must be submitted by e-mail to Marypat Corbett, <u>mcorbett@soy.org</u>. Ms. Corbett will confirm receipt of each proposal; if receipt has not been confirmed, your proposal has not been received.

If your proposal is not authorized by signature on Attachment A Proposal Authorization Cover Page, it may not be considered and may be rejected.

**Submission of Questions:** All questions regarding the preparation of proposals must be submitted in writing (by e-mail) to Marypat Corbett at <u>mcorbett@soy.org</u> no later than 4pm CDT on April 10, 2024. All questions and answers will be available on the WISHH website on or shortly after April 12, 2024. No questions will be answered over the phone or in person; all questions must be in writing and sent via email.
